

Data Classification Examples

This document shows current examples of University data at varying classification levels of sensitivity. Note this is not a comprehensive list of all University Data.

The following are current examples of data at the High Security level:

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| 1. Social Security Numbers (SSNs) | 12. Parent's Legal Surnames Prior to Marriage |
| 2. Employer Tax Identification Numbers (e.g., partners) | 13. Most Student Records |
| 3. Drivers License Number | 14. Most personnel file information |
| 4. State Identification Card | 15. Privately-owned Trade Secrets |
| 5. Passport Numbers | 16. Critical University application files (e.g. Financial System application files) |
| 6. Checking or Savings account numbers | 17. Private Contributor Records |
| 7. Credit or Debit Card Numbers | 18. Pre-patent Research Data |
| 8. Personal Identification (PIN) Code | 19. Medical records (PHI) |
| 9. Electronic Identification Numbers | 20. Disability records |
| 10. Passwords | 21. Data Protected by Non-disclosure Agreements |
| 11. Biometric Data | 22. Police Records |

The following are current examples of data at the Moderate Security level:

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| 1. Official meeting minutes before approved |
| 2. Drafts of official documents |

The following are examples of data at the Normal Security level:

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| 1. Employee "directory data", including name, title, current position, work phone number, currently assigned office or station |
| 2. Student "directory data" such as name, campus phone, campus address, email address (if not block via student request) |
| 3. Published materials (e.g., alumni magazines, University website content). |
